Obituary



Gary Hayden passed away unexpectedly on February 5, 2015. He was born on September 9, 1944 in Easton, Maryland to Thomas and Mary Hayden. His family moved to Tucson when he was four years old and he lived in Tucson most of his life. Growing up, Gary was involved in both sports and 4H club where he won numerous awards and honors in both. He attended Catalina High School and then the University of Arizona. While attending the University of Arizona he became a letter winner in wrestling as a freshman. He was a Wildcat through and through. While in Tucson he owned a tropical fish store, a travel agency called Worldwide Travel, and a computer store called Computers Plus. In 1976 he married the love of his life, Cookie Good. He instantly became a stepfather. In 1966, while attending the U of A, he picked up the game

of bridge, which became his passion and his profession throughout the rest of his life. His bridge career is full of many outstanding accomplishments. His greatest tournament was his last Nationals in Providence, RI last November where he won over 300 master points, the number thousands of people try to make in their lifetime to achieve the ranking of Life Master. He ranked 8th in all time master points with over 47,000. (Not bad for a man who was told by his new wife that he was going to have to stay home and be a father now that he was married. Bridge then took a backseat for many years.) Recently, he was on the team representing the USA in Bali and won the gold medal, his fifth senior world championship, which is more than anyone else in the bridge history. Gary was a great player and remarkable teacher. Although very competitive and successful, he never forgot about those in need. He had a heart for those less fortunate and was a very giving man. His love for Christ was evident in everything he did. When asked one time if he could invite any three people, past or present to dinner, who would they be, he responded, "Jesus Christ, Abe Lincoln and Roger Barrier, his preacher." Gary is survived by his sister, Mary Howard Congdon and her husband, Malcom; his wife, Cookie Hayden; his step-children, Scot Johnson and his wife, Susie and Tiffany Steinmetz and her husband, Greg; and five grandchildren, McKenna Johnson, Cassidy Johnson, Avery Johnson, Teagan Steinmetz and Tanner Steinmetz. Gary will be deeply missed by both family and friends including the entire bridge world. "NICE TRY, PARTNER"

<p>Dummy</p>	<p>Opposite a 15-17 1NT, West had the HCP for game and cue-bid 3♠, hoping that East had something in Spades and could bid 3NT. Does North's 4♠ seem a bit nutty? Or completely so? It was neither, North expected that 4♠ doubled would be a good sacrifice against an E-W game.</p>

As we said, North fully expected that 4♠ would go down and South went out of his way not to disappoint her. The defense cashed a Club and two Diamonds, then led a second round of Clubs, ruffed by Declarer. Now Declarer drew trumps in two rounds and proceeded with: ♥A, Heart ruff, Diamond ruff, Heart ruff, Diamond ruff, Heart ruff. If you have worked your way through this orgy of ruffing you will see that Declarer has by now scored 9 tricks and had finally established that long Heart in his hand. That is the good news. The bad news is that all the trumps are now gone, the lead is in Dummy, and there is no way back to Declarer's hand to score that long Heart. Down one! Sitting as Dummy, watching the play unfold, you have no doubt noticed where Declarer went wrong. What do you plan to say, now that the play is over?

Bridge etiquette requires that Dummy say something like "Nice try, Partner", which in this case loosely translates to "You blundering imbecile!" What is a nicer try by Declarer, one that actually makes 10 tricks?

Declarer must use his trump entries to better effect. After ruffing the Club, Declarer should cash the ♥A, ruff a Heart, return to hand with a trump and ruff another Heart. This subtle change in timing solves the entry problem and now, by the time that the Hearts are finally ruffed out, there will still be a way back to Declarer's hand (via another ruff). Making four! "Nicely played, Partner!"

District 17 Board Meeting

Tucson, AZ, 28 February 2015.

NOTE: This is a partial summary of the D17 Board Meeting. The final minutes are subject to D17 Board approval at the next D17 Board Meeting in Las Vegas, NV, June 2015.

General

- 1. Opening remarks from President Darwin Afdahl:

- I thanked Unit 356 and Tournament Steve Reynolds and the many volunteers. The morning salmon, bagels, pastries and coffee were well received by the early risers. Steve and his volunteers provided a classy reception Friday night for the D17 Board members and invited Unit 356 members. Frank Fine, Albuquerque, NM, Steve Nordberg, El Paso, TX, and Becky Roger, Las Vegas, NV were welcomed as new D17 Board members. There was a Moment of Silence remembering Garey Hayden who passed in early February 2015.

- 2. Newly elected D17 Officers for 2015 are:

President: John Grossmann, Greely, CO

Vice President: Art McHaffie, Santa Fe, NM

Secretary, Bonnie Bagley, Colorado Springs, CO

Treasurer, Jerry Ranney, Denver, CO

Election Secretary, Flo Newlin, Denver, CO

This was a good election, and I believe the new officers will do a great job. As I mentioned early, I did not run for election, as I believe after two years as President, it was time for new leadership. I will remain as the D17 Board Member from Tucson.

- 3. As of December 31, 2014, the Treasurer reported total assets were \$111,053. This reflected a net loss of \$37,596 for 2014. The loss was \$20,451 larger than the original budgeted loss of \$17,145. The major reasons for the higher-than-budgeted loss were the unit loss subsidy of \$17,794 (Las Vegas and Albuquerque) and total income being \$2,107 less than budgeted. Regional sanction fees were \$7,657 under budget due to table counts significantly under budget for Albuquerque, Las Vegas, Mesa, and Phoenix (table count was 1531 table under budget). The budget for 2015 shows a Net Income of \$12,000 which is dependent on estimated table count.

- 4. The October 2015 Phoenix Regional has been canceled due to a playing site was not available.

- 5. Caddie Guidelines were approved and will be attached to the D17 Policy Manual.

- 6. The following was approved to be added to the D17 Regional Tournament Plan **(D17 RTP) and D17 Regionals are requested to add a note to the Daily Bulletins.**

- • **Please don't wear cologne, perfume, or scented lotions during the tournament; they may cause fragrance-related reactions.**

- 7. In 2015, District 17 Board meetings will be in Las Vegas (June), and Taos (replacing Phoenix) (October).
