August 7, 2016 Unit 356 minutes of Board Meeting

Members present: Anne Hinge Ann Shaylor, Joan Merrill, Darwin Afdahl, Steve Reynolds, Jud Jones and Betsy O'Dell

July minutes were accepted. Joan Merrill made a motion to accept and Steve Reynolds seconded the motion.

There were no questions on the treasurer's report.

D17 Darwin said that Bonnie has been automatically accepted because the name of her opponent, John, was taken off the ballot.

There are about 1/2 dozen new members a month. A breakdown of members by zip code was done.

Hotel Tucson's renovation work is almost done. A room was comped for the ACBL president. They are working on having rooms upgraded. This might be an issue for the NLM regional but not the Tucson sectional.

There is a NLM regional in Phoenix in October. This is within two weeks of our tournament and might affect our attendance.

It is important to make sure that Small Slams Bridge Club at Saddlebrook (on Thursday) is invited to our NLM tournament.

NLM tournament prizes include stickers, T-shirts, and convention card holders. There is also a drawing for a prize at the White Stallion Ranch.

Ann will publicize the NLM tournament and other tournaments at Streams.

Flyers were put on the bulletin boards at Pima Community College and the U of A for caddies. Caddie pay will be changed to \$10 an hour from \$30 a session. There will be a need to be on top of the hours worked. A maximum of \$40 was suggested.

The tournaments for November and January are on track. Ann needs to find speakers for the January sectional. Ann and Adair are working on speakers for the regional at the end of March. Possible speakers were discussed.

The restaurant at the Radisson is really cooperative. There will be three lunch choices.

- sitting down in the restaurant
- hot buffet (sitting at our tables)
- our buffet (sandwiches and salad)

The Radisson is being asked to make a deal about people staying at the hotel. If staying on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, possibly Sunday could be free. If staying Monday through Friday, possibly Saturday and Sunday could be free. The carpeting in the ballroom and the lighting improvements will or will not be done. We have no control over it.

Suni has donated 20 tables to the unit. He donated 140 chairs to the Greek Church. It is understood that we can borrow these chairs if needed. This will save us money.

We have 28 Bridgemates. We need about 60. We need to buy approximately 35. If 45 are ordered, the cost would be \$126 a unit. 35 would be \$140 a unit. Steve suggested that we try to use the 28 that we have toward the 60 needed to get a better rate. The unit contribution would be \$2400 as the cost for 5

years of rental fees. The unit was asked to spot the money to buy Bridgemates. If we had them, we could save money on caddies. The directors bring their own Bridgemates to regional tournaments except for NLM regional tournaments. We have 5 times where we could use them. They include Skyline Member Appreciation Game, the Holiday Game, the two sectionals and the NLM regional. A motion was made by Joan to pass our unit contribution for the Bridgemates. It was seconded by Ann. If Adobe Bridge Club ever goes under, 1/2 of the Bridgemates would go to the unit and the other half would go to charity.

Cindy is looking into prices for flyers to be printed. It was suggested that she needs to discuss this at the next board meeting before a decision is made.

Are bulletins needed at regional tournaments? They are labor intensive and expensive. Darwin will find out if the information could be put on the website only. There needs to be further discussion with Adair, Cindy and Darwin. It was suggested that people without computer skills might be upset.

The flyers for the NLM regional are ready to go to Phoenix.

Old Pueblo regional is the Tucson Winter Regional. We needed to put time and location in the title for marketing purposes. Darwin said that as long as D17 is on the flyer, the name does not matter.

Jud will instruct on Wednesdays. There will be 4-5 boards each week to discuss.

Senior Olympics - Adobe 2017 Sunday was suggested because if it is on a Saturday, clubs would need to close their regular games and not make money. There is a possibility that this could be made into a unit game.

Cindy would like to be a full board member. Carolyn Reynolds would like to come back on the board. We might need a new I/N representative.

**District 17 Board Meeting
Phoenix, AZ August 20, 2016**

NOTE: This is a partial summary of the D17 Board Meeting. The final minutes are subject to D17 Board approval at the next D17 Board Meeting in Tucson, AZ, Saturday, March 4, 2017.

General

1. Opening remarks from President Jerry Ranney:

Jerry thanked Phoenix Unit 354, Tournament Chair (JoAnne Lowe) and the many volunteers. The regional was held at the Talking Stick Resort, (a beautiful hotel and casino, rooms were large and spacious and only \$99.00++ per night). I believe they are trying to return next year. There were 1653 tables but the dates were earlier in the year. I would expect an increase in tables if we go back next year. The opening Pro/Am Pairs had 39.5 tables (our Cindy Shoemaker was 6th overall) with 38.5 tables in the Charity Open Pairs. The 9:30am and 1:30pm games usually had 70+ tables in the Gold Rush and Stratified Open Pairs. The 7:15pm Stratified Open Swiss had less than 20 teams. The Bracketed KO team events had less than 30 teams. Sunday had A/X/Y Swiss Teams and 0-3000 Flighted Swiss Teams (Top 3 teams in each 0-3000 flight receive GOLD POINTS). The attendance at each of the District 17 Regionals this year has been down as compared to previous years.

2. Bonnie Bagley, D17 representative to the ACBL National Board, said the Board meeting at the Washington NABC's was "light", but the Board is discussing reducing the number of Board Members.

3. Marion Robertson, Western Conference President (Districts 17, 21, 22) asked each District President to appoint two members to a newly formed Western Conference Task Force tasked with recommending efforts to cut costs and improve benefits to our members. D17 President Jerry Ranney appointed Mesa Unit 351 Board member Jim Horton, and John Grossmann, Colorado.

4. As of August 11, 2016 District 17 total assets were \$102,811, this reflects the net income for 2016 of -\$4,787. The Denver and Las Vegas regional incomes were each down significantly with a combined income for those two regionals of \$8,631 below budget. Total expenses to date are \$72,013, \$35,237 under budget.

5. Gary Zeiger, the Director in Charge stated that attendance for the KO's was bad, going down, but the attendance for the Pair events was OK

6. D17 Regional table fees will increase to \$13.00 per session effective January 01, 2017. The \$4.00 increase per table will be split with \$3.00 going to the district and \$1.00 going to the unit sponsoring the regional. HOWEVER, the district will pay the Western Conference fee of \$2.25 per table, which means the unit will have a net increase of \$3.25 per table.

7. Reminder for Tournament Chairs: the Budget and Schedule for Regionals must be approved by D17 prior to two NABC's.

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES

Brian Gunnell

♠ AQ8 ♥ 643 ♦ K2 ♣ QJ765	Both Vulnerable <i>South West North East</i> 1♣ Pass 1♥ Pass 2♥ Pass 6♥ Pass Pass Pass
<i>Dummy</i>

<i>Declarer</i>	
♠ J752 ♥ AKQJT2 ♦ A75 ♣	West leads the ♦J and when Dummy goes down you can count only 11 tricks: six trumps in hand, two Diamonds and a Diamond ruff in Dummy, and two Spades (regardless of who holds the ♠K). Where's the 12 th trick?

To make your contract, you will need to score a third Spade trick, but before playing Spades, you must take that ruff in Dummy, and draw trumps. So your sequence of plays starts like this:

Win the Diamond in Dummy

Draw two rounds of trumps (West shows out on the second round)

Cash the ♦A

Ruff a Diamond in Dummy

Ruff a Club

Draw the last round of trumps

So far Declarer has done just fine, getting the Diamond ruff in Dummy while at the same time minimizing the chances of an overruff. The enemy trumps are now gone, and it's all down to the Spade suit. The ♠Q is finessed and let's say that it wins the trick, the defenders following with the Three and the Four. What next? What are the alternatives and which one do you choose?

You are doomed to failure if the missing Spades are 5-1 ... and destined for success if the suit is 3-3 ... so all that matters is the play which gives you the best chance when the Spades are 4-2? The two choices are:

- *Either*, cash the ♠A, hoping that West started with a doubleton King.
- *Or*, lead the ♠J from hand (which West will cover with the King). This caters for East holding the doubleton Ten or doubleton Nine, allowing Declarer's mighty ♠7 to provide the 12th trick!

And your choice is?

This should be an easy decision! Kx with West is one winning chance ... Tx or 9x with East is two winning chances. It doesn't need a mathematician to figure out which play is more likely to succeed.

After the percentage play brings home the slam, Declarer will avoid saying "My 6♥ was a bit optimistic, but of course I wouldn't have bid it without the Spade Seven". Unless, that is, he wants to infuriate the opponents.
