You can access member information online anytime by going to the Unit 356 homepage at <http://www.southernarizonabridge.com/> and click UnitDirectory. Simply login with your ACBL number. (Please read the login page if you are a first time user.). Updated once a month, the Unit 356 Directory can only be accessed by members of Unit 356. All the information comes from the ACBL and can only be changed at ACBL.

To search for a player, type in as much as you remember of first name, last name and/or phone number, then click Search. If the first letter in first name and/or last name is capital, only names that starts with the letter is shown.

For example, Ra will show Randy, but not Barbara and ra will show both Randy and Barbara. Only the first phone number minus area codes is used in the search. All players that fulfill the requirements will be listed. Select one and click OK. Click clear before starting a new search.

To remove yourself from the directory, select your own name and hit the opt out button, type in your ACBL number, and click the opt out button again.

## Northwest Tucson Bridge Clubs unite to raise \$8,298 for Alzheimer's Association

On the summer solstice, the American Contract Bridge League (ACBL) holds *The Longest Day* event to raise money for the Alzheimer's Association. From sunrise to sunset, ACBL members across the country host fundraisers, which include all kinds of bridge, card games, mah-jongg, athletic events and teaching lessons to advance the cause. This year on Wednesday, June 21, 2017 three Northwest Tucson clubs, Small Slams

Bridge Club, MountainView Bridge Club and The Bridge Center of Greater Tucson united



to participate in The Longest Day fundraiser. They hosted several activities, which included various bridge games - duplicate, social and newcomers, mah-jongg, canasta, a 50/50 raffle and a silent auction to raise money. There was a sea of purple shirts as the Alzheimer's Association made them available for sale.

After the games everyone was invited to the SaddleBrooke One Activity Center to enjoy complimentary wine and cheese, while they bought more 50/50 raffle tickets and bid on the silent auction items. The clubs raised over \$8,298, all of which will be sent to the Alzheimer's Association. Small Slams Bridge Club underwrote the expenses of the event with help from SaddleBrooke One, Basha's and AJ Peters of the Bridge Center who volunteered his services as Director of the duplicate game.

The community was extremely generous in contributing to the event with donations to the silent auction, buying raffle tickets, bidding on the silent auction items.

The planning committee consisting of Joyce Honorof, Chairperson; Terry Coe; Linda Depew; Sue Hagerty; Al Spaet; Barbara Starrett and Sue Young has decided to have this event next year and, with the generous support of the community, raise even more money to support the Alzheimer's Association.

All three clubs are ACBL sanctioned and hold duplicate games that award ACBL masterpoints. MountainView Bridge Club is an open club and holds games Tuesdays and Fridays at 1 PM. Small Slams Bridge Club is an invitational club that is limited to SaddleBrooke residents and their guests with 0-750 masterpoints and holds games Thursdays at 1 PM. Membership report: Ann stated we are down 47 from last month which was to be expected, up 6 from last year.

Cactus Flower Regional: Cindy introduced the new IN representative, Diana Galis. Cindy stated the flyer was complete for the September tournament and everything was going as planned. There will be a new start time for this tournament.

It was also discussed to change the time for our next regional tournament to 10 and 3. Steve stated that Barry Abraham had done a survey several years ago and the results were the majority wanted 9 and 1:30 start times. The board will do a survey through the ACBL to see what members want at this time.

Member Appreciation Game: Mindy Hawkins stated the flyer is complete. It is on our website. The event will be held on June 11 at Skyline Country Club.

Caddy Status: Jud stated we have plenty of caddies for our tournaments.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:00

A motion was made by Steve to give Ann Hinge a raise to \$300.00 due to an increase in expenses. It was seconded by Carolyn and approved by the board.

Website – Rotating pictures vs photo page on the website is open to further discussion.

Unit Directory – The unit directory needs to be explained and advertised in the Kibitzer.

Membership- -There are 1085 members in the unit up 20 from July 2016. 109 more people have email addresses than in 2015. This means that we are reaching more people.

Membership Appreciation Game – There were 73 tables - 36 in the morning and 37 in the afternoon. It needs to be advertised as 2 single sessions not as a double session. The Holiday Party will be discussed at a future meeting. Themes for hospitality for July and September will be announced. There will be pizza at the August game at Green Valley.

District 17 Board Meeting  
Las Vegas, NV June 24, 2017

NOTE: This is a partial summary of the D17 Board Meeting. The final minutes are subject to D17 Board approval at the next D17 Board Meeting in Taos, NM, October 14, 2017.

General

1. Opening remarks from President Jerry Ranney:

Jerry thanked Las Vegas Unit 373, Tournament Chair (Sandra Gagnon) and the many volunteers. The regional was held at Bally's Hotel & Casino, room rates (I believe) were \$99 during the week and \$149 Friday and Saturday, parking used to be free, now self-parking is 1-4 hours \$7, 4-24 hours \$10 and valet parking is 4-24 hours \$18. Playing conditions were well lighted and clean, but it was a long walk from the hotel/casino. Players received a \$3 chit for each session of a two-session event; however, coffee or water was \$5 and sandwiches were \$12-\$15. There were 2189 tables compared to 2406 last year. The attendance at each of the District 17 Regionals this year has been down as compared to previous years.

2. Bonnie Bagley, D17 representative to the ACBL National Board, said the

Board hired a new CEO Bahar Gidwani who she met. She was impressed with his background. (More information is in Bonnies July ScoreCard column.)

3. As of June 10, 2017, District 17 total assets were \$125,244, this reflects the net income for 2016 of +\$7,480. The four regionals held to date are below their projected income by about \$4,000. Income to date is \$8,409. Total expenses to date are \$97,366, \$9,884 under budget.

4. The Roswell, NM Unit has asked to be dissolved and this is expected to be approved at the NABC Board meeting in Toronto this month. They have 20 members who will be reassigned to other units depending on their location.

5. The AZ Senior Regional in Mesa 2018 has been cancelled as they could not find a suitable location. It was discussed that maybe Laughlin, NV; El Paso, TX; or Tucson, AZ could hold the regional next year. Each location has been asked to determine if they would like to hold the regional.

6. Unit Sanctions for 2018 and 2019 should submitted to JoAnne Lowe.

7. Several clubs are having success with 5<sup>th</sup> Chair or Supervised Play Mentoring Programs. They play twenty boards with a mentor discussing the bidding and play after every hand.

8. Phoenix NLM Regional in April had 230 tables at the combined NLM Regional and Sectional.
  
9. The D17 Board voted to reduce the board members from 14 to 10 plus The National Board Representative. We have discussed this for several years. The District has a little over 9,000 members with Denver, Phoenix and Tucson 1,000+ members. Texas and WYO each with less than 200 members, each had a representative with full voting rights. Texas was moved in NM at Large and WYO was moved to CO at Large. Denver and Phoenix each had two representatives, they were reduced to one each. The reductions will save about \$6,000 per year.

# READING THE LEAD

<p>♠ AJ7 ♥ 8543 ♦ 876 ♣ AJ9</p>	<p>Both Vulnerable <i>South West North East</i> Pass 2♦ 2♠ 3♦ 4♠ Pass Pass Pass</p>
<p><i>Dummy</i></p> <p><i>West East</i></p> <p><i>Declarer</i></p>	<p>East's Weak Two shows 5-10 HCP and a 6-card suit. N-S cruise into 4♠, West leads the Diamond Two won by East's Ace, then a low Diamond comes back, ruffed by Declarer, West following with the Jack. As Declarer, what can you deduce from the play so far? And how do you plan to play the hand?</p>
<p>♠ KT9653 ♥ AT ♦ T ♣ KT82</p>	

The bidding tells you that East started with six Diamonds and West with three. If West had ♦KQx he would have led the King ... if East had ♦AK he would have played the King on the first trick ... therefore (unless there is some fiendish false-carding going on) West started with ♦KJ and East with ♦AQ. Who has the ♠Q?

Generally speaking, you would play the Spades from the top, playing for the drop of the ♠Q in one or two rounds. This line is a slight favorite over the alternative of finessing (one way or the other) against the Queen. But the odds changed when East showed long Diamonds (leaving less room in his hand for Spade cards), so here you decide to cash the ♠K and finesse the ♠J on the second round. This works out spiffingly when East discards a Diamond on the second round of Spades. You draw the last trump and now the card in question is the ♠Q. Who has it?

You cannot be sure, so you plays ♥A and another Heart, hoping to learn more, and on the second Heart East plays the King. At this point you can be fairly certain that East started with 1=2=6=4 distribution. As East has four Clubs to West's two does that make East more likely to hold the Queen?

Not in this case! East has shown up with 9 HCP, there's no room left in his 5-10 hand for the ♠Q. So, you play West for that card and, thanks to a little counting, you brings home your vulnerable game with an overtrick.

Declarer had to get several things just right in order to make the maximum number of tricks: (a) she had to deduce the whereabouts of the Diamond honors from the play at Trick 1, (b) she had to play West for Spade length based on East's known Diamond length, (c) she had to play on Hearts to complete her picture of the hand, (d) she had to remember that East was limited to 10 HCP and therefore could not hold the ♠Q.
