Fee Increase

We at the Bridge Center of Greater Tucson are very grateful for the support we've had over these past two years, and the loyalty of a growing number of those in Tucson's bridge community. We've done our best to provide excellent added value to our players and keep card fees low, but over that time the sanction fees we pay to the ACBL have increased, and costs for food & drink, bridge supplies and extras have all increased.

For this reason, we will be raising our card fees by a dollar, beginning November 1st. Our regular open games will be priced at \$8, and the charge for a regular 999er games will go to \$6. This one dollar increase for both regular game types is necessary, and we hope you will understand and continue to enjoy what the Bridge Center has to offer. Regular prices will also continue to apply to regular club championships and member appreciation games. Any surcharge for special games (supporting special ACBL projects) will remain unchanged.

Please also note that our popular Discount Cards, presently \$72 for 12 plays, will go up on November 1st to \$84 for 12 punches, or \$7 per punch. Punches remaining on our older card can be applied to any game at any time, and will continue to be honored at their original value of \$6 per punch.

BRIDGE BITES #77

A SITTING DUCK

Brian Gunnell

♠ K3 ♥ 6 ♦ AQ853 ♣ QJT98	N-S Vulnerable <i>South West North East</i> 1♠ Pass 2♦ 1♥ 2NT Pass 3NT 2♥ Pass Pass
<i>Dummy</i> West East Declarer	N-S are a little shy of the 25 or so HCP generally required to make 3NT. On the other hand, they do have a source of tricks in Clubs which gets Declarer up to eight winners. And where there are eight there's often a ninth, as East is about to find out to his detriment.
♠ AT764 ♥ AT83 ♦ T6 ♣ K3	

West dutifully leads the Heart Nine and East's Jack is taken by Declarer's Ace (holding up won't achieve anything). The ♣K comes next and East ducks that, if only for practice. East takes his ♠A on the next round and continues with Clubs. That was good play by East, he figured that persisting with Hearts would just hand Declarer her ninth trick, so he adopted a passive defense. So, where *is* that ninth trick coming from now?

It is conceivable that West has the ♦K but the bidding suggests that this card is more likely to be in the East hand. If so, then East will be under pressure when the Clubs and Spades are cashed. Here is the full diagram:

Visualize the end-position after one Heart, five Clubs and two Spades (ending in hand). East turns out to be void in Spades and started with four Clubs. His last five cards will all be red and he's a sitting duck for an end-play:

Declarer exits with the ♥T. East wins that and is done for, and whatever he returns gives Declarer that 9th trick.
